APA style

Book with one author

Author last name, first initial. (Publication Date). *Title*. City of Publication: Publishing company.

Sullivan, G. (2000). *Picturing Lincoln*. New York: Clarion Books.

Book with two authors

Author last name, first initial & author last name, first initial. (Publication Date). *Title*. City of Publication: Publishing company.

Neal, S.A. & Gray, S. (1989). *The women of Florence*. New Haven: Yale UP.

Journal or Periodical

Author last name, first initial. (Year, Month Day). Article Title. *Periodical Title*, Volume Number(Issue), pages.

Hooper, J. (2006, February). Is this the machine that will finally find life on Mars? *Popular Science*, 286(2), p. 66-73.

Encyclopedia

Author's last name, first initial. (Date). Title of Article. *Title of Encyclopedia* (Volume, pages). Place published: publisher.

(1995). Fire Fighting. *The World Book Encyclopedia* (vol. 5, p. 75-77). Chicago: World Book, Inc.

Internet

Author, A. (Date Published). Article name. *Name of website*. [Retrieved] Date, [from] URL of Website

Farley, M. (2006, January 24). Canada shifts to right in election. *Sun Sentinel*. Retrieved March 13, 2006, from http://www.sun-sentinel.com/Canada+Shift=adv_article

* **With magazines and newspapers, encyclopedias and websites** – If an author's name is not given, begin your citation with the publication date.

****With internet articles** – If there is no author and no date of publication, begin your citation with the article title. **Remember to give careful consideration to the validity of the resource, especially if there is no date of publication.**

*****With titles** – Only the first letter of the title or subtitle will be capitalized, unless the title includes a proper noun.
